

## Current State Codes

Each state has building code boards that make final code adoption decisions. NEEA provides funding for code development, technical assistance, and education support within each state. Current and expected codes are listed below:

The Idaho Building Code Board has promulgated the 2015 IECC for commercial, effective Jan 1, 2018. The residential code will remain as an amended 2012. Effectively the 2009 IECC.	No decision has been announced on timing of the next code change process.

\*Due to building code board funding issues, the next commercial code will be a four-year cycle. The 2018 code will be effective on July 1 2020. Residential code development will be staggered. The next residential code change is scheduled for July 1, 2021.
