#### Overview:


The ultimate desired outcome of the LLLC Program's Market Transformation efforts is for LLLC adoption to become standard practice for commercial buildings, in which the majority of lighting products come with embedded sensors and controls as the default option. In support of this long-term Program goal, the NEEA Marketing team defines strategies and tactics to deepen awareness, understanding, and desirability among key market actors.

In 2023 and 2024, in partnership with utilities and market actors, the NEEA Marketing team developed several new LLLC marketing resources including written and video case studies, one-pagers, and technical guides. These assets are available on the LLLC page of the <a href="BetterBricks website">BetterBricks website</a>, with some designed for utility rebranding.

NEEA would like to promote understanding of the breadth of these regional resources and discuss how utilities are—or could be—leveraging them by sharing an overview of the LLLC Regional Utility Toolkit. Additionally, there will be a discussion to identify yet-to-be developed resources that would be of use.

#### **Our Ask of You:**

#### **Brief Overview:**

In Q1 (February 5<sup>th</sup>), the Regional Portfolio Advisory Committee (RPAC) reviewed the charter for RPAC and the Coordinating Committees. The ask was to review the charter and offer edits as needed; NEEA staff did not recommend any changes to either the RPAC charter nor the coordinating committee charters for this year.

Other key highlights from the February 5 meeting included:

- a recap of recent dual fuel workgroup meetings (measurement and product);
- an overview of the upcoming Heat Pump Water Heater (HPWH) consumer campaign (set to run in June/July);
- and, in an effort to help contextualize Market Transformation (MT) concepts, two MT highlights/stories: Luminaire Level Lighting Controls (LLLC) and Retail Products Portfolio (RPP).

#### **Federal Funding Workgroup Update:**

The next workgroup meeting will be on February 26<sup>th</sup>. Likely topics include home rebates program and energy audit training program type content.

#### 2024 Stakeholder Engagement Activities:

In February, NEEA staff conducted a biannual stakeholder satisfaction survey. A series of in-person visits to stakeholders are also planned in the coming months. One of the goals of the stakeholder survey and inperson visits is to inform a review of the coordinating committee structure and process. Ultimately, we want to ensure the committees are structured and resourced to provide the highest value to the region. We're not expecting a whole-sale revamp of the charter or purpose (which we went through a couple of years ago), but more of right-sizing and assessment of the coordinating committees. - 1:1 Meetings with Committee Members (ad hoc)


#### **Next Steps:**
