Quick Refresher - Vote Process

- **Related RPAC Responsibilities:**
 - Portfolio optimization (regional perspective) & program advancement (milestone votes)
- **Current RPAC Decision Points:**
 - Concept Advancement & Program Advancement milestones
- **Vote Prep Process:**
 - "Tee-Up" presentation (~ 6 months before vote)
 - Full presentation (~3 months before vote)
 - Business Case / Milestone Doc emailed (~6 weeks before vote)
 - Team huddles to align on regional input (~2-5 weeks before vote)

Current Process for Transitioning a Program to Long-Term Monitoring & Tracking

6-12 month process

- 1. "Tee-Up" presentation (~ 6-12 months before transition is planned)
- 2. Transition Market Progress Evaluation Report (T-MPER) published (typically ~3-6 months before transition is planned)
- Overview of results of T-MPER (~3-4 months before transition is planned)
- **Announce plans to transition** (~1-2 months before transition is planned)








What you need to know: Key Takeaways

- NEEA's Manufactured Homes Program is moving to the Long-Term Monitoring & Tracking Phase LTMT.
- The program will continue to:
 - Track adoption and diffusion of NEEM+
 - Track the Federal standard and HUD code and their effective dates
 - Coordinate with ENERGY STAR
 - Track adoption of DOE's Net Zero Ready Spec
 - Test heat pumps in manufactured homes and measure energy savings potential
 - Maintain relationships with NEEM and manufacturers



Manufactured Home Programs and Sales History





NEEA's Manufactured Homes Program

The program has supported the Northwest Energy Efficient Manufactured Housing Program (NEEM)+ specification, developed by Northwest Energy Works since 2014.

Market has achieved stable position

NEEM+ market share is currently low, but stable.

Manufacturers see NEEM+ as a niche offering, appealing to customers who are either particularly concerned about energy efficiency or are siting homes in jurisdictions that require manufactured homes to meet efficiency standards...Nonetheless, most manufacturers and retailers reported their NEEM+ home sales had been steady or had risen in the past two years.




Recommendations

Recommendation 1: NEEA should continue to monitor the manufactured home market as the new ENERGY STAR specification takes effect in 2026 and the new federal standard takes effect in 2025.

Recommendation 2: NEEA and Northwest Energy Works should continue to work with EPA to support an update to the ENERGY STAR V3 specification that allows NEEM+ homes to qualify without installation of a heat pump.

Recommendation 3: NEEA and partner organizations like the Regional Technical Forum should conduct an analysis to assess the relative energy savings between ENERGY STAR V3 and ZERH manufactured homes and NEEM+ homes and assess typical installation practices to ensure specifications effectively drive manufactured home efficiency in the Northwest.





The Road Ahead

- Share RPAC Memo Q3 2024
- Move program to LTMT and begin measuring diffusion metrics
- Coordinate with ENERGY STAR and DOE to align NEEM+ (Managed by Codes and Standards)
- Test approaches to adding heat pumps (Scanning)




